Resolution 1 (2015)

Ecological Catastrophes and IDP's

Adopted by the Economic and Social Council at its 1st meeting, on 9 April 2015

Economic and Social Council,

Underlines that the number of human rights violations and violations of IDPs' economic, social and cultural rights will decrease in the result of cooperative work of all Member States;

Affirms that these violations are not consciously planned and instigated but result from inappropriate policies;

Welcomes humanitarian assistance from aid agencies and the UN Member States in order to meet basic needs and to respond to increasing numbers of IDPs;

Reminds that National authorities have the primary responsibility to facilitate IDPs livelihoods by establishing the necessary conditions as well as providing the means for IDPs to return voluntarily, in safety and dignity to their places of origin or to resettle in another part of the country and to facilitate their reintegration;

- 1. Suggests paying greater attention to the creation of livelihood and job opportunities for IDPs in their place of refuge and return;
- 2. *Proposes* the UN Member-States to adopt the universal definition for the status of those IDPs uprooted by ecological disaster;
- 3. Recommends to conduct awareness sessions on human rights and conflict resolution for people prone to become IDPs adolescents;
- 4. Further requests to maintain the civilian and humanitarian image of the places where internally displaced persons are sheltered and calls for protection of such locations;

- 5. Strongly recommends to provide good rehabilitation for children that have suffered from an ecological catastrophe on a governmentally paid basis without any discrimination based on a religion, ethnicity, gender and etc.,
- 6. Invites the UN Members States to continue their donations in response to the situation with IDPs,

Decides to remain actively seized of the matter.
