Resolution (2017)

Adopted by the Security Council at its meeting on 9-10 November 2017

The Security Council,

Reaffirming the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations and the obligation of all States to refrain in their international relations from the threat or use of force against the sovereignty, territorial integrity and political independence of any State,

Gravely concerned at the situation in Afghanistan, which resulted from the violation of principles of the Charter and of the recognized norms of inter-State conduct,

Reaffirming also the inalienable right of all peoples to determine their own form of government and to choose their own economic, political and social system free from outside intervention, subversion, coercion or constraint of any kind whatsoever,

Noting the conclusion at Geneva, on 14 April 1988, of the Agreements on the Settlement of the Situation Relating to Afghanistan and the completion of the withdrawal of foreign troops in accordance with those Agreements,

Deeply conscious of the urgent need for a comprehensive political solution of the situation in respect of Afghanistan,

- 1. Affirms that the principles of international law fully extend to cyberspace;
- 2. Offers to stop hostilities immediately and face the sides of the conflict to negotiate with the help of measures such as but not limited to:
 - a. insistent recommendations to the present government to cut down any radical reforms held by the government for the time of negotiations;
 - usage of the UN Truce Supervision Organization for providing ceasefire and protection for the representatives of the un peacekeeping forces aimed at helping the government of Afghanistan to preserve stability during negotiations;

- 3. *Calls upon* illegally involved Member States to stay aside from the conflict in order to prevent contributing to further intensification and to take appropriate measures, such as but not limited to:
 - a. preventing provision of financial services or transfer of financial recourses;
 - b. reporting on inspections, seizures, and disposals, as well as the sale, supply on transfer of missiles, weapons etc among others;
- 4. *Encourages* all member states to provide volunteer and humanitarian support for affected by the conflict countries under the agenda of UN-Bodies such as but not limited to UNHCR (United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees), IOM (International Organization for Migration), FAO (Food and Agricultural Organization);
 - 5. Recommends Member States to:
 - a. hold a democratic referendum concerning the selfidentification of Afghanistan under auspices of the UN and other parties legally involved after the ceasefire;
 - b. provide financial and other ways of support to hold the UN's peacekeeping mission in Afghanistan.
